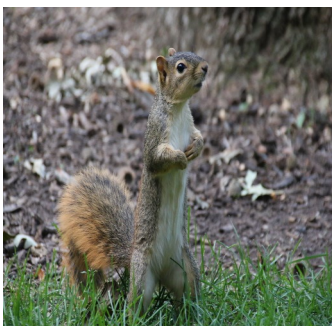


All about reading at Patcham Junior school:

Our reading culture is based around reading for pleasure, which is far more likely if a child is reading at their level. At Patcham we use Renaissance Place to monitor reading. From Years 3- 6 we set 20 minutes of reading homework a day.

Children complete a star test in school using the renaissance software and are then given a colour code and numerical key matched to their reading level. Each level/colour code is broken down into 3 subsequent levels. The children will complete a star test every half term to monitor progress.

Children are not able to quiz books at home. However, if the book being read is on the Accelerated Reader (AR) system – then they can quiz the book that day or the day after completion at school. At home, you can log in to their reading profiles by going to: school website/ learning/ reading and phonics/accelerated reader icon. On the site you will be able to see what your child has read and quizzed on at school. You can view their personal bookshelf too.

Using **AR book finder** (<https://www.arbookfind.co.uk/collections.aspx>) at home is a helpful tool for looking up books within their level and interests. You can enter their key code, authors or search by interest to find books.

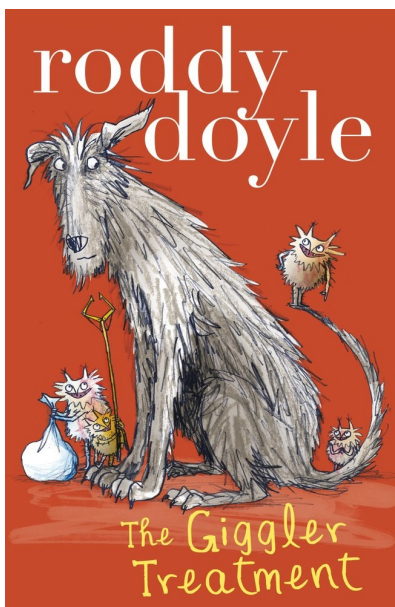
Here's what some children learnt...
